## ICAO Council Candidate 2022

Austria is honoured to be a candidate for membership in the Council of the International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) for the term 2022–2025 at elections to be held during the 41<sup>th</sup> Assembly in October 2022 in Montréal (Canada). Austria presents its candidature for part II of the ICAO Council in close cooperation with all member states of the Abis group: Belgium, Croatia, Ireland, Luxembourg, The Netherlands, Portugal and Switzerland.
